NOTICE OF ACTION TAKEN BY WRITTEN CONSENT OF OUR MAJORITY STOCKHOLDERS

To Our Stockholders:

We are writing to advise you that certain common and preferred stockholders, owning approximately 70.94% of combined voting power of the common and preferred stock, have approved by written consent in lieu of a stockholders' meeting, the proposal to effect a reverse stock split of our outstanding common stock on a one (1) share for fifteen (15) share basis. On March 15, 2013, our board of directors unanimously approved the above proposal.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE NUMBER OF VOTES RECEIVED FROM STOCKHOLDERS BY WRITTEN CONSENT IS SUFFICIENT TO SATISFY THE STOCKHOLDER VOTE REQUIREMENT FOR THESE ACTIONS UNDER NEVADA LAW AND NO ADDITIONAL VOTES WILL CONSEQUENTLY BE NEEDED TO APPROVE THE ACTIONS.

No action is required by you. The accompanying Information Statement is furnished only to inform stockholders of those actions taken by written consent described above before they take effect in accordance with Rule 14c-2, promulgated under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended. This Information Statement is first being mailed to you on or about April 17, 2013, and we anticipate the effective date of the proposed actions to be May 7, 2013, the record date, or as soon thereafter as practicable in accordance with applicable law, including the Nevada Revised Statutes.

WE ARE NOT ASKING YOU FOR A PROXY AND YOU ARE REQUESTED NOT TO SEND US A PROXY.

The accompanying Information Statement is for information purposes only and explains the actions taken by written consent. Please read the accompanying Information Statement carefully.

INFORMATION STATEMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 14(c)
OF THE SECURITIES EXCHANGE ACT OF 1934 AND
REGULATION 14C THEREUNDER

This Information Statement is being sent by first class mail to all record and beneficial owners of the common stock, \$0.001 par value per share and the preferred stock, \$0.00001 par value per share, of NET SAVINGS LINK, INC., a Nevada corporation, which we refer to herein as “NSAV,” “company,” “we,” “our” or “us.” The mailing date of this Information Statement is on or about April 17, 2013. The Information Statement has been filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission (the “SEC”) and is being furnished, pursuant to Section 14(c) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the “Exchange Act”), to notify our stockholders of actions we are taking pursuant to written consents of a majority of our stockholders in lieu of a meeting of stockholders.

On April 16, 2013, the record date for determining the identity of stockholders who are entitled to receive this Information Statement, we had 766,633,114 shares of common stock issued and outstanding and 1,500,000 shares of Series A preferred stock outstanding. Each share of Series A preferred stock had 1,000 votes. Accordingly, the combined voting power of all of the Series A preferred stock was 1,500,000,000 votes. The holders of the Series A preferred stock and the common stock vote as a single class on all matters submitted to stockholders, subject to the common shares having 1 vote per share and the Series A Preferred shares, each having 1,000 votes per share.

The common stock and Series A preferred stock constitute the sole outstanding classes of NSAV voting securities. Each share of common stock entitles the holder thereof to one vote on all matters submitted to stockholders. Each share of preferred stock entitles the holder to 1,500 votes on all matters submitted to stockholders. The preferred and common stock vote as a single class on all matters submitted to stockholders.

NO VOTE OR OTHER CONSENT OF OUR STOCKHOLDERS IS BEING SOLICITED IN CONNECTION WITH THIS INFORMATION STATEMENT. WE ARE NOT ASKING YOU FOR A PROXY AND YOU ARE REQUESTED NOT TO SEND US A PROXY.

On March 15, 2013, certain stockholders who beneficially owned 1,608,000,000, or approximately 70.94% of the combined voting power of the common stock and Series A preferred stock consented in writing to effect a reverse stock split of our outstanding common stock on a one (1) share for fifteen (15) shares basis.

Also on March 15, 2013, our board of directors approved the above action, subject to approval by the stockholders. No other corporate actions to be taken by written consent were considered.

We are not aware of any substantial interest, direct or indirect, by security holders or otherwise, that is in opposition to matters of action being taken. In addition, pursuant to the laws of Nevada, the actions to be taken by majority written consent in lieu of a special stockholders meeting do not create appraisal or dissenters’ rights.

Our board of directors determined to pursue stockholder action by majority written consent of those shares entitled to vote in an effort to reduce the costs and management time required to hold a special meeting of stockholders and to implement the above action in a timely manner.

Under Section 14(c) of the Exchange Act, actions taken by written consent without a meeting of stockholders cannot become effective until 20 days after the mailing date of this definitive Information Statement, or as soon thereafter as is practicable. We are not seeking written consent from any stockholders other than as set forth above and our other stockholders will not be given an opportunity to vote with respect to the actions taken. All necessary corporate approvals have been obtained, and this Information Statement is furnished solely for the purpose of advising stockholders of the actions taken by written consent and giving stockholders advance notice of the actions taken.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: Why did I receive this Information Statement?

A: Stockholders owning a majority of the combined voting power of our outstanding shares of common stock and Series A preferred stock took action by written consent in lieu of a stockholders’ meeting. Federal securities laws require that our other stockholders receive this Information Statement before the action can become effective.

Q: What actions did the stockholders take?

A: The stockholders executed a written consent on March 15, 2013 approving the proposal that we effect a reverse stock split of our issued and outstanding shares of common stock on a one (1) share for fifteen (15) basis with any fractional shares being rounded up to the next whole share. Pursuant to SEC rules and regulations, these actions require notification to all of our stockholders.

Q: What action do I need to take as a stockholder?

A: You are not required to take any action. The actions approved by written consent can take effect after 20 days from the date of mailing this Information Statement. Following the reverse split, your present share certificates will be replaced with a new certificate without any action on your part.

Q: Am I entitled to appraisal rights?

A: No. You are not entitled to appraisal rights in accordance with Nevada law in connection with the actions taken by written consent.

Q: Will I recognize a gain or loss for U.S. federal income tax purposes as a result of the reverse stock split?

A: You should not recognize any gain or loss for U.S. federal income tax purposes as a result of the reverse stock split.

Q: Where can I find more information about the company?

A: As required by law, we file annual, quarterly and current reports and other information with the SEC that contain additional information about our company. You can inspect and copy these materials at the public reference facilities

SUMMARY

This summary sets forth certain selected information contained in this Information Statement that may be important to you to better understand transactions referred to in this summary. This summary also provides cross-references to the location in the Information Statement of the information summarized.

NET SAVINGS LINK, INC.

We were incorporated in the State of Nevada on February 21, 2007 and began doing business as a mining and exploration company. During November 2010, we changed our business plan from mining and exploration to a membership based Internet Company that provides members with links to predominantly other 3rd party websites that offer savings and discount deals. These savings and discount offers are organized and presented on our website located at www.netsavingslink.com, to save members money on everyday expenses such as groceries, dining, travel, shopping, debt service, insurance - as examples.

NSAV is a reporting company under the Exchange Act, and our public filings can be accessed at www.sec.gov. NSAV's common stock is listed for quotation on the OTC-QB under the trading symbol "NSAV".

Reverse Stock Split

Our board of directors has determined that it is in our best interest to effect a reverse stock split of our issued and outstanding shares of common stock, on a one (1) share for fifteen (15) shares basis (the "Reverse Stock Split"). We believe that reducing the number of outstanding shares of our common stock through the Reverse Stock Split could increase the per share market price of our common stock, which would provide a more favorable trading market for the shares.

OUTSTANDING VOTING SECURITIES AND CONSENTING STOCKHOLDER

As of April 16, 2013, we have 766,633,114 shares of common stock issued and outstanding and 1,500,000 shares of Series A preferred stock outstanding. Each share of Series A preferred stock had 1,000 votes. Accordingly, the combined voting power of all of the Series A preferred stock was 1,500,000,000 votes. The holders of the Series A preferred stock and the common stock vote as a single class on all matters submitted to stockholders, subject to the common shares having 1 vote per share and the Series A Preferred shares, each having 1,000 votes per share.

As of March 15, 2013, the combined voting power of the common stock and Series A preferred stock was 2,266,633,114 votes. Two stockholders who beneficially owned 1,608,000,000, or approximately 70.94%, of the combined voting power of the common stock and Series A preferred stock consented in writing to effect a reverse stock split of our outstanding common stock on a one (1) share for fifteen (15) shares basis. Because the actions were approved by the written consent of stockholders holding a majority of our outstanding shares, no proxies are being solicited with this Information Statement.

Nevada corporate law provides in substance that unless a company's articles of incorporation provide otherwise, stockholders may take action without a meeting of stockholders and without prior notice if a consent or consents in writing, setting forth the action so taken, is signed by stockholders having not less than the minimum number of votes that would be necessary to take such action at a meeting at which all shares entitled to vote thereon were present.

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The consenting stockholders are the beneficial owners of 1,608,000,000, or approximately 70.94%, of the combined voting power of the common stock and Series A preferred stock. The consenting stockholders voted in favor of the proposed actions described herein pursuant to written consent dated March 15, 2013. No consideration was paid for the consent. The consenting stockholders are set forth below.

Security Ownership of Certain Beneficial Owners and Management

The following table sets forth the total number of shares owned beneficially by David Saltrelli and Peter Schuster on March 15, 2013 and on April 16, 2013. The stockholders listed below have direct ownership of his shares and possess voting and dispositive power with respect to the shares.

(1) Each share of Series A preferred stock has 1,000 votes. Accordingly Messrs. Saltrelli and Schuster have 1,500,000,000 Series A preferred votes and 108,000,000 common votes or a total of 1,608,000,000 of votes, or a total of 70.94% of the total voting power which they may vote on any issue presented to the shareholders. Accordingly have the ability to control the outcome of any issue presented to shareholders. Further, the holders of the Series A preferred stock and the Company's common stock shall vote as a single class on all matters submitted to stockholders, subject to the common shares having 1 vote per share and the Series A preferred shares having 1,000 votes per share.

REVERSE STOCK SPLIT

On March 15, 2013, our board of directors and principal stockholders holding a majority of our outstanding common stock approved a one (1) share for fifteen (15) shares reverse split of our issued and outstanding common stock. The effective date of the split will be established at the discretion of our board of directors. We presently anticipate the split to occur on or about May 7, 2013.

All shares of our common stock have equal rights and privileges with respect to voting, liquidation and dividend rights. Each share entitles the holder thereof to (i) one non-cumulative vote for each share held of record on all matters submitted to a vote of the stockholders; (ii) to participate equally and to receive any and all such dividends as may be declared by the board of directors; and (iii) to participate pro rata in any distribution of assets available for distribution upon liquidation. Holders of our common stock have no preemptive rights to acquire additional shares of common stock or any other securities. The common stock is not subject to redemption and carries no subscription or conversion rights.

All shares of our Series A preferred stock have equal rights and privileges with respect to voting, liquidation and dividend rights. Each share entitles the holder thereof to (i) 1,000 non-cumulative votes for each share held of record on all matters submitted to a vote of the stockholders; (ii) to participate equally with other Series A preferred shares and to receive any and all such dividends as may be declared by the board of directors; and (iii) to participate pro rata with other shares of Series A preferred stock prior to any distribution of assets available for distribution upon liquidation to common shares. Holders of our Series A preferred stock have no preemptive rights to acquire additional shares of Series A preferred stock or any other securities. The Series A preferred stock and the common stock are not subject to redemption and carry no subscription or conversion rights.

Amendment to Articles of Incorporation

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In connection with the Reverse Stock Split, we will not file with the State of Nevada an amendment to our articles of incorporation to reflect the split. Our current authorized capitalization will remain unchanged at 1,000,000,000 shares of common stock with a par value of \$0.001 per share and 100,000,000 shares of preferred stock with a par value of \$0.00001 per share. Of the 100,000,000 authorized shares of preferred stock, 1,500,000 shares have been designated as Series A preferred stock with 1,000 votes per share.

Under applicable Nevada law, a corporation may effect a reverse stock split without correspondingly decreasing the number of authorized shares of the same class or series if:

- (a) The board of directors adopts a resolution setting forth the proposal to decrease the number of issued and outstanding shares of a class or series; and
- (b) The proposal is approved by the vote of stockholders holding a majority of the voting power of the outstanding shares of the affected class or series.

As our board of directors has approved the Reverse Stock Split and stockholders holding a majority of the voting power of the outstanding shares of common stock and Series A preferred stock have also approved the split by written consent, upon the effectiveness of the split, each share of our issued and outstanding common stock will be reverse split on a one (1) share for fifteen (15) shares basis. Stockholders who would otherwise be entitled to receive fractional shares, because they hold a number of shares of common stock that is not evenly divided by the split ratio, will have the number of new shares to which they are entitled rounded up to the next whole number of shares. No stockholders will receive cash in lieu of fractional shares.

Effect of the Reverse Stock Split

Split shares of common stock issued in connection with the Reverse Stock Split will be fully paid and non-assessable. The number of stockholders will remain unchanged as a result of the Reverse Stock Split. The Reverse Stock Split will decrease the number of outstanding common shares but will not affect any stockholder's proportionate interest in our company prior to the closing of the Share Exchange, except for minor differences resulting from the rounding up of fractional shares. The par value of our common stock will remain unchanged. While the aggregate par value of our outstanding common stock will be decreased, our additional paid-in capital will be increased by a corresponding amount. Therefore, the Reverse Stock Split will not affect our total stockholders' equity. All share and per share information will be retroactively adjusted to reflect the split for all periods presented in our future financial reports and regulatory filings.

Although it is generally expected that a reverse split will result in a proportionate increase in the market price of the split shares, there can be no assurance that our common stock will trade at a multiple of our current price, or that any price increase will occur or be sustained. If the market price of our stock declines after the implementation of the Reverse Stock Split, the percentage decline as an absolute number and as a percentage of our overall market capitalization would be greater than would be the case in the absence of the reverse split.

Furthermore, the possibility exists that the reduction in the number of outstanding shares will adversely affect the market for our common stock by reducing the relative level of liquidity. In addition, the Reverse Stock Split may increase the number of the stockholders who own odd lots, or less than 100 shares. Stockholders who hold odd lots typically will experience an increase in the cost of selling their shares, as well as possible greater difficulty in effecting such sales. Consequently, there can be no assurance that the Reverse Stock Split will achieve the desired results outlined above.

Following the Reverse Stock Split, we will have issued and outstanding approximately 51,108,875 shares of common stock, without giving effect to the rounding up of fractional shares. The outstanding Series A preferred shares will not be affected by the Reverse Stock Split.

Following the Reverse Stock Split, we will have the corporate authority to issue 948,891,125 shares of authorized but unissued common stock. 50,000,000 of these shares have been designated to be issued under our 2012 Non-Qualified

Stock Option Plan thereby leaving 898,891,125 shares of common stock available for issuance. These shares may be issued without stockholder approval at any time, in the sole discretion of our board of directors. The authorized and unissued shares may be issued for cash, to acquire property or for any other purpose that is deemed in the best interests of our company. Any decision to issue additional shares will reduce the percentage of our stockholders' equity held by our current stockholders and could dilute our net tangible book value. We have no immediate plans, proposals or arrangements, written or otherwise, to use these authorized and unissued shares of common stock following the Reverse Stock Split other in connection with the possible acquisition of additional oil and gas properties.

(1) 50,000,000 shares of common stock are reserved for our 2012 Non-Qualified Stock Option Plan (the "Plan"). These shares have not been issued and are not outstanding but merely designated for issuance pursuant to the Plan.

Our authorized and unissued shares could possibly be used by management to oppose a hostile takeover attempt, delay or prevent changes of control, or changes in or removal of management. This could include transactions that are favored by a majority of stockholders, or in which the stockholders might otherwise receive a premium for their shares over then-current market price, or benefit stockholders in some other manner. Tender offers or other non-open market acquisitions of stock are usually made at prices above the prevailing market price. In addition, acquisitions of stock by persons attempting to acquire control through market purchases may cause the market price of the stock to reach levels that are higher than would otherwise be the case.

The available authorized and unissued shares of common stock gives the company the ability to cause a potential anti-takeover effect by creating potential dilution to the number of outstanding shares. Such dilution will cause a party attempting a takeover to be required to buy more shares of the company stock and to expend additional resources to accomplish a takeover. The Reverse Stock Split is not part of a plan by management to affect the ability of third parties to take over or change control of the company, nor are we currently contemplating any such anti-takeover plan.

We will not become a private company as a result of the reverse split, we expect that our common stock will continue to be quoted on the OTC-QB and we plan to continue to file periodic and other reports with the SEC under the Exchange Act.

Following the Reverse Stock Split, the share certificates you now hold will be replaced with new certificates. You are not required to exchange your certificates for new certificates the old certificates now being in our possession will be cancelled. In the future, new share certificates will be issued reflecting the stock split, but this in no way will affect the validity of your current share certificates. The reverse split will occur on the effective date without any further action on the part of our stockholders. After the effective date of the reverse split, each share certificate representing shares of pre-split common stock will be deemed to represent 1/15 shares of post-split NSAV common stock. Certificates representing post-split common stock will be issued in due course by our transfer agent: Holladay Stock Transfer, 2939 North 67th Place, Scottsdale, Arizona 85251, telephone (480) 481-3940. We request that stockholders do not send in any of their stock certificates at this time.

As applicable, new share certificates evidencing post-split shares that are issued in exchange for old pre-split certificates representing restricted shares, will contain the same restrictive legend as on the old certificates. Also, for

purposes of determining the term of the restrictive period applicable to the new post-split shares, the time period during which a stockholder has held their existing pre-split shares will be included in the total holding period.

Accounting Matters

The par value per share of the common stock will remain unchanged after the Reverse Stock Split. As a result, on the effective date of the Reverse Stock Split, the stated capital on the balance sheet attributable to the common stock will be reduced proportionally, based on the exchange ratio of the Reverse Stock Split, from its present amount, and the additional paid-in capital account will be credited with the amount by which the stated capital is reduced. The per share common stock net income or loss and net book value will be increased because there will be fewer shares of the common stock outstanding. The company does not anticipate that any other accounting consequences would arise as a result of the Reverse Stock Split.

Other Effects on Outstanding Shares

When the Reverse Stock Split is implemented, the rights and preferences of the outstanding shares of the common stock will remain the same after the Reverse Stock Split. Each share of common stock issued pursuant to the Reverse Stock Split will be fully paid and non-assessable. The Reverse Stock Split would result in some stockholders owning “odd-lots” of less than 100 shares of the common stock. Brokerage commissions and other costs of transactions in odd-lots are generally higher than the costs of transactions in “round-lots” of even multiples of 100 shares.

No Appraisal Rights

Under Nevada Corporations Law, stockholders are not entitled to appraisal rights with respect to the proposed Reverse Stock Split and amendment to our articles of incorporation.

United States Federal Income Tax Consequences of the Reverse Stock Split

The following is a summary of certain material U.S. federal income tax consequences of the Reverse Stock Split to a stockholder (hereinafter a “U.S. stockholder”) that is a “United States person,” as defined in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”). This summary is not intended to be a complete discussion of all possible U.S. federal income tax consequences of the Reverse Stock Split and is included for general information purposes only. Further, it does not address any state, local or foreign income or other tax consequences. For example, state and local tax consequences of the Reverse Stock Split may vary significantly as to each U.S. stockholder, depending upon the state in which such stockholder resides or does business. Also, it does not address the tax consequences to holders that are subject to special tax rules, such as banks, insurance companies, regulated investment companies, personal holding companies, foreign entities, nonresident alien individuals, broker-dealers and tax-exempt entities. In addition, the discussion does not consider the tax treatment of partnerships or other pass-through entities or persons who hold our shares through such entities.

The discussion below is based on the provisions of the U.S. federal income tax law as of the date hereof, which are subject to change retroactively as well as prospectively. This summary also assumes that the shares held by a U.S. stockholder prior to the Reverse Stock Split (“Old Shares”) were, and the shares owned by such stockholder immediately after the Reverse Stock Split (“New Shares”) will be, held as “capital assets,” as defined in the Code, generally property held for investment. The tax treatment of a stockholder may vary depending upon the particular facts and circumstances of such stockholder. The discussion below regarding the U.S. federal income tax consequences of the Reverse Stock Split also is not binding on the Internal Revenue Service or the courts. Accordingly, each stockholder is urged to consult with his, her or its own tax advisor with respect to the tax consequences of the Reverse Stock Split.

No gain or loss should be recognized by a U.S. stockholder upon such stockholder's exchange, or deemed exchange, of Old Shares for New Shares pursuant to the Reverse Stock Split. The aggregate tax basis and holding period of the New Shares received in the Reverse Stock Split should be the same as such stockholder's aggregate tax basis and holding period in the Old Shares being exchanged. Special tax basis and holding period rules may apply to holders that acquired different blocks of stock at different prices or at different times. Holders should consult their own tax advisors as to the applicability of these special rules to their particular circumstances.

We are hereby notifying our stockholders of the approval of the Reverse Stock Split and, pursuant to the Exchange Act, filing this Information Statement on Schedule 14C, which will be mailed to all stockholders of record as of the record date established therefore.

On August 6, 2012, we filed a Certificate of Designation with the Nevada Secretary of State, which designated 100,000,000 shares of preferred stock as "Series A Preferred Stock". Each share of Series A Preferred Stock has 1,000 votes. During August 2012, we issued a total of 1,500,000 shares of Series A Preferred Stock to Messrs. Saltrelli and Schuster. Accordingly, with 766,633,114 shares of common stock outstanding as of March 15, 2013, Messrs. Saltrelli and Schuster have 1,608,000,000 votes on any issued presented to the shareholders and accordingly have the ability to control the outcome of any issue presented to shareholders. The Company shall not, without the affirmative vote or written consent of the holders of at least a majority of the outstanding Series A Preferred Stock (i) authorize or create any additional series of stock ranking prior to or on a parity with the Series A Preferred Stock as to dividends, voting

rights, or the distribution of assets upon liquidation, or (ii) change any of the rights, privileges or preferences of the Series A Preferred Stock. Further, the holders of the Series A Preferred Stock and the Company's common stock shall vote as a single class on all matters submitted to stockholders, subject to the common shares having 1 vote per share and the Series A Preferred shares, each having 1,000 votes per share.

The board of directors has fixed the close of business on April 16, 2013, as the record date for the determination of Stockholders who are entitled to receive this Information Statement.
